Giving Back – 4H & FFA

Rules and Guidelines:

To have your project considered you must fill out and complete the application.

Applicants must be legal age adults in the USA applying on behalf of children or special needs adults, working to complete an individual or group project of antique restoration.

Single applicants may receive up to \$150 in parts or product donations per project.

Groups applicants may receive up to \$300 in parts or product donations per project.

Further parts needed to complete a project can be purchased at a discount ranging from 10-40% off list price. Certain limits and restrictions apply.

Larger donations for special projects or larger groups will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Engines or projects should be owned by the club or the kids doing the project. It is our hope that these projects are retained by the kids or sold to raise more money for the club and the kids' future projects.

Do we have to be working on an engine to apply? While Flywheel Supply primarily manufactures and sells stationary engine parts, we also sell some items and parts for other restoration projects, and you are welcome to apply for those projects as well. They are handled on a case-by-case basis.

Please allow up to two weeks for processing applications and review, more time is always better.

What do we have to do for the free stuff? I am glad you asked. We ask the following:

- Pictures of the project along the way (before and after is nice if possible) for us to put on our website and profile.
- Photo of the kids with the project
- Display Project "Sponsored in by or in part by Flywheel Supply" sign along your project display. A decal for this purpose will be provided. Just peel and stick to the display board or signage.
- Post the project to Facebook and social media. Specifically, the Flywheel Supply Facebook page, Hit & Miss Antique Engines / Flywheel Supply, Hit Miss Engine Collectors, and any other groups related to the brand you might be working on. Organic posts, from customers like you, on Facebook is the new "Word of Mouth" and we all know that to be the best and most powerful form of advertising. The best thing to do would be to make several small posts of the project along the way and a finished post when done. For advertising to work well it must be seen at LEAST 5 times by people. So multiple posts are a good thing. But at the same time, we don't want to spam these groups and make it annoying to them. If you would like help writing the post or knowing where to post it a member of our staff would be glad to help you. Make sure to mention in the posts the project was sponsored by FWS and even provide a link to our catalog or our giving back page on our website.

Anyone in the pictures should sign and have the parent or legal guardian sign the attached photography release form. These can be returned via email to the above given email address.

Anyone caught abusing the system and getting parts for their own personal projects and their for cheating kids out of the money allocated to the program WILL be publicly shamed on Facebook!
